


DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 20th JUNE 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Six hundred and sixty-one (**661**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from fourteen (**14**) states – Lagos (230), Rivers (127), Delta (83), FCT (60), Oyo (51), Edo (31), Bayelsa (27), Kaduna (25), Plateau (13), Ondo (6), Nasarawa (3), Ekiti (2), Kano (2) and Borno (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **36** (35 states + FCT).
- One hundred and thirty-seven (**137**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in thirteen (**13**) states – Rivers (52), Lagos (31), Borno (11), Nasarawa (10), FCT (6), Gombe (6), Kebbi (6), Delta (5), Kano (5), Ekiti (2), Enugu (1), Osun (1) and Oyo (1).
- Nineteen (**19**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in three (**3**) states – Lagos (15), Rivers (3) and Gombe (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has released [guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship](#).
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the [Police and other Law Enforcement Agencies](#) in Nigeria
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the [case management guidelines](#) (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the [safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19](#)

- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the [integration of private labs](#).

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Official visit of the DG NCDC and WHO Officer-in-Charge to Plateau, Edo and Akwa-Ibom State Government to engage with the state leadership for strengthened response to COVID-19**
- **Ongoing review of criteria for hotspot Local Government Areas (LGAs) and sensitivity analysis**
- **A total of 360 Persons of Interest/returnees from 6 countries (Ghana, UK, India, Italy, Germany and United States) were received and are being monitored in Abuja**
- **Trained over 200 Health Care Workers (HCWs) across Missau, Ningi and Dass Local Government Areas of Bauchi state**
- **Optimised and activated two GeneXpert laboratories in Kaduna and Nasarawa states**
- **Trained additional personnel on sample collection, packaging and transportation in Anambra and Enugu states**
- **Disseminated messaging priorities to all state health educators, Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) and stakeholders**
- **Commenced documentary projects in Oyo and Ebonyi states**
- **Completed photo documentation in Kano**
- **Engagement of Surveillance and Laboratory teams in states to improve Turn Around Time (TAT) from sample collection , communication of tests result and issuing of test certificate**

- SORMAS and Laboratory teams developed an automated electronic system model design to improve data quality and synchronise Laboratory information system
- Distributed travellers kits, guidelines and POIs/returnees were issued COVID-19 test appointments at the airport
- Distribution of Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) to General Hospitals (GHs) and Primary Health Care facilities (PHCs) in Bayelsa State
- Supportive supervision provided in holding areas in GHs, PHCs and private facilities to ensure Screening, Isolation and Notification (SIN)
- Identified IPC focal persons in health facilities in Bayelsa
- Developed new graphics for COVID-19 symptoms and guidelines on re-opening of religious centres
- Created a toolkit with messages for safe opening of religious centres
- Distribution of Information Education and Communication (IEC) materials to General Hospitals (GHs) and Primary Health Care facilities in Bayelsa State
