


DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 17th JUNE 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Five hundred and eighty-seven (587) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from eighteen (18) states Lagos (155), Edo (75), FCT (67), Rivers (65), Oyo (56), Delta (50), Bayelsa (25), Kaduna (18), Plateau (18), Enugu (17), Borno (12), Ogun (12), Ondo (7), Kwara (4), Gombe (2), Kano (2), Kebbi (1) and Sokoto (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- Three hundred and fourty-four (344) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in eighteen (18) states Ogun (60), Ebonyi (42), Bauchi (41), Kano (33), Rivers (29), Borno (23), Lagos (21), Delta (19), Kaduna (16), Gombe (15), Jigawa (12), Plateau (8), Nasarawa (6), Ondo (6), FCT (5), Edo (4), Kebbi (3) and Enugu (1).
- Fourteen (14) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK25)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has released *guidelines* on the re-opening of places for worship.
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police</u> and other Law Enforcement Agencies in Nigeria
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons</u> suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ</u> document.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the <u>integration of private labs</u>.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case</u> management guide.
- NCDC releases periodic <u>public health advisories</u> to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of</u> <u>face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make</u> <u>your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing</u> <u>mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the <u>management of dead bodies</u>.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a
 guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19</u>
 cases.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a
 <u>National Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u>
 document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19
 <u>available on the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task
 force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Engagement with states on contact tracing and case finding challenges
- Development of Influenza Like illnesses (ILI) and Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI) protocols for states
- Development of implementation plans for activities in surveillance work plan
- Out of 356 Persons of Interest (POIs) that arrived in FCT, Abuja 310 were tested with 5
 positive results reported (2% positivity rate)
- Selection of IPC focal persons for 10 functional private health facilities in Enugu
- Ongoing orientation meeting with Federal Ministries of Agriculture, Women Affairs, Youth and Sports on risk communication and community engagement
- Development of Micro plan for intensification of risk communication and community engagement in 21 high burden Local Government Areas (LGAs)

- Continued engagement with states on contact tracing approach and case finding
- Data and SORMAS teams held finalisation meeting on dashboards automation for state and national level analysis
- Ongoing monitoring of adherence to National Interim Case Management guidelines by clinicians across treatment centres
- Conducted training on IPC for stakeholders across Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Ebonyi
- Onsite sample collection training in Enugu
- Conducted training of health reporters on factual reporting on COVID-19 in Kano
- Completed additional commodities distribution to all States and all labs within the laboratory network
- Ongoing analysis of utilisation records received from states for enhanced forcasting and needs assessment
