




Fig 1. Distribution of cases (Epi Week 50 only)

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- In Week 50, the number of samples tested increased to **73,919** from **62,537** reported in week 49. These were reported in **36** states and FCT (Tables 1).
- In Week 50, the number of new confirmed cases increased to **6,406 (8.6%)** from **2,859 (4.6%)** reported in week 49. These were reported in **22** states and FCT (Tables 1 & 2).
- In Week 50, the number of discharged cases increased to **3,791** from **296** in week 49.
- There were 4 deaths reported in the last one week (Tables 1 & 4).
- Cumulatively, since the outbreak began in Week 9, 2020 there have been 223,887 cases and 2,985 deaths reported with a case fatality rate (CFR) of 1.3% (Tables 1 & 4).
- In Week 50, the number of in-bound international travellers tested was **8,306** of which **522** (6.3%) were positive compared to **285** (3.3%) (out of **8,597** tested) in week 49.
- In Week 50, the number of out-bound international travellers tested was **8,421** of which **1,464** (17.4%) were positive compared to **560** (7.4%) (out of **7,520** tested) in week 49.
- Worldwide, there has been **273,900,334** confirmed COVID-19 cases with **5,351,812 deaths** resulting in a case fatality rate of **2.0%**.




Figure 3: Daily epidemic curve of confirmed cases as reported per day as of 19th December 2021

#### AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN




Figure 4: Chart with age and gender breakdown of cases and deaths (WK10, 2020 – WK50, 2021)

#### IN FOCUS: COVID-19 Awareness Ahead of the Yuletide Season

Over weeks leading to the Yuletide season, Nigeria has recorded an exponential surge in COVID-19 cases. The response to COVID-19 requires a whole-of-society approach, therefore, individuals, families and institutions have a critical part to play in ensuring adherence to public health and social measures during the festive period.

The Federal Government of Nigeria, through the Presidential Steering Committee on COVID-19, the Federal Ministry of Health, as well as Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) and its partners, have therefore intensified efforts to remind Nigerians of the risk we face and need to take collective responsibility to reduce transmission of the virus. The NCDC has launched its Yuletide season communication campaign themed #CelebrateResponsibly. #CelebrateResponsibly focuses specifically on measures Nigerians need to take to protect themselves and loved ones from COVID-19 during this holiday period.

COVID-19 continues to threaten the lives and the livelihoods of Nigerians therefore we must not let our guards down. We urge Nigerians to take all precautions necessary to ensure we and our loved ones live to celebrate many more events and festivities including the following:

- 1. Please avoid all non-essential travel within and outside Nigeria to reduce the risk of transmission.
- 2. The virus that causes COVID-19 is more likely to spread in mass gatherings especially when held indoors with full capacity and poor ventilation. We strongly recommend outdoor events with physical distancing, compulsory use of facemasks, and provision of handwashing facilities or hand sanitisers.
- 3. Please make use of every opportunity provided to get vaccinated against COVID-19. The government has made these vaccines available for all eligible citizens and booster doses available for those previously vaccinated.

The Celebrate Responsibly campaign which spans from the Christmas holiday through the start of the new year, emphasises the responsibility of the government, private sector, institutions, associations, communities, families and individuals in enforcing public compliance to COVID-19 preventive measures to combat the COVID-19 pandemic. NCDC urges religious and traditional leaders and heads of organisations and businesses to join the campaign by adopting the key messages and sharing within their institutions and communities.

#### **RESPONSE**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 which is the highest emergency level in Nigeria. This is led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC) and through the deployment of **61** Rapid Response Teams (RRT) to states. Currently, response activities include:

- Developed plans for the fourth wave
- Ongoing engagement with high burden states on response to the fourth wave
- Ongoing supportive supervision for trained contact tracers in Akwa Ibom, Kaduna, Kano, and Oyo states
- Ongoing case finding and contact tracing in 15 states

- Continue follow up with University College Hospital (UCH), Ibadan and FCT on infection rise in respective health facilities
- Ongoing dissemination of key messaging to focal persons across all States on 4<sup>th</sup> wave presence and issues regarding intervention prioritization
- On-going distribution of RDT kits to Lagos State Biobank Laboratory, Central Public Health Laboratory (CPHL), Yaba and Centre for Disease Control (CDC)
- Distributed Laboratory consumables, PPE and IPC commodities to all 36 States Ministries of Health and Tertiary Health Care Facilities including the FCT in the month of December
- Ongoing media monitoring and social listening for COVID-19 updates and misinformation
- Developed and published a press release on the Celebrate responsibly campaign
- Developed and disseminated FAQs on the Omicron variant
- Held SBC material review workshop in collaboration with our partners and MDAs supported by BA-N
- Trained media and spokespersons in Bauchi and Oyo state by BA-N
- Trained Oyo, Sokoto and Bauchi state team on using social media for public health response
- Stakeholders' engagement meeting with persons with disabilities
- Launch celebrate responsibly campaign for the yuletide season
- Ongoing meeting with relevant stakeholders in preparations for the festive period
- Deployed National Rapid Response Team to support the Shiloh and Holy Ghost congress events held in Ogun State
- Concluded RDT step-down training in Abia, Nasarawa and Enugu States for increased testing
- Continued engagement with states to ensure regular reporting and response continuity
- Continued roll out of antigen based rapid diagnostic test (Ag-RDT) kits in collaboration with partners
- Continued tracking and collation of data from states for strategic coordination
